# V.G.L. Senior's & Veteran's Championship

## Conditions of Entry and Competition

### Event

Individual 18 hole stroke Senior's Open Championship – Best Gross Score  
Individual 18 hole stroke Senior's Best Nett Score  
Individual 18 hole stroke Veteran's Open Championship – Best Gross Score  
Individual 18 hole stroke Veteran's Best Nett Score

Seniors – 50 - 64 years of age as at date of event  
Veterans – 65+ years of age as at date of event

In the event of a tie.  
Gross events – sudden death playoff.  
Nett events - count-back system as recommended by Golf Australia will be used.

### 1. Lunch & Presentation

Lunch is available to purchase. Presentations will take place after the event.

### 2. Draw

Draw will be sent to club and be available for viewing online on Thursday after closing date.

### 3. Trophies

Trophies will be awarded to:

- Best Gross Senior's Open Championship (Perpetual Trophy - to be returned for following year's event).
- Best Gross Veteran's Open Championship (Perpetual Trophy - to be returned for following year's event).
- Best Nett – Senior's
- Best Nett \_ Veteran's
- Nearest the pins

### 4. Registration

Players are to report to V.G.L. official with their Golf Link Card at least 20 minutes prior to the stipulated tee time.

### 5. Conditions of Competition

- All competitions shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as adopted by the Royal & Ancient Club of St Andrews Scotland, subject to local rules that are in force at the course where the tournament is conducted.
- Any disputes and protests will be decided by the VGL Men's Golf Committee whose decision will be final.
- The VGL Men's Golf Committee makes all arrangements, and has full power to alter the conditions, should they deem it desirable and will have the right to refuse the entry of any person without being required to give any reason for such refusal.
- Use of Motorised carts is only permissible if prior application has been approved. Any player over the age of 70 may use a ride on motorised golf cart.
- All competitors and caddies must comply with the dress code of the V.G.L.
- Entries will be refunded at the discretion of the VGL Executive.
- The use of mobile phones by a competitor or his caddie whilst on a golf course is distracting and inconsiderate. If the competitor or caddie is in possession of a mobile phone it must be on silent or turned off. A player or caddie cannot receive or make calls during the match - **Penalty - Loss of Hole.**

Receiving (ONLY) and viewing Short Message Services (SMS), between the playing of holes, is not considered receiving or making phone calls" during the match.

Exception: Players/caddies are permitted to make phone calls from the course to the clubhouse or to event officials for rules/emergency assistance.

- A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance ONLY. If during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance measuring devices that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his/her play (e.g. gradient, wind speed, temperature, club selection etc) the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which penalty is DISQUALIFICATION regardless of whether any such function is actually used.

### Note:

If a player wishes to uses a phone to look up weather, it is not considered to be actively measuring or gauging the conditions and is permissible. Reports provided by a weather station, through an app or internet browser, are not a breach of rule 14-3

A phone with a compass feature can be used as a distance-measuring device, because a compass only provided directional information and does not gauge or measure variable conditions or assist the player in his play.

You can use a phone as a distance-measuring device, that has an inbuilt spirit level as part of the functionality but it is not part of the distance-measuring app., provided that you do not use the spirit level in any manner that might assist you in your play.
